In Warsaw, the partnership met for the third coordination meeting, hosted by the colleagues of the National Union of Cooperatives Advisory for invalids and for the Blinds. During this meeting, the colleagues at the University of East Anglia (England) - Norwich Business School - thanks to the preparatory work for the dance movement workshops, art therapy and handicrafts made by ATI, RE.LE.GART and TAMAT, have prepared the first draft of the Report on the methodology of the AMM project.

The document not only explains the reasons for the choice of this method but also explains the guidelines for the implementation of the different laboratories. The meeting was crucial in deciding the criteria for assessing the integrated methodology and to ensure the transferability of project results: both through innovative communication channels, such as the AMM multimedia wiki developed by the Spanish partner D-O-T as well as through the AMM guidelines for art - dance movement and handicraft workshops developed for trainers.

THE METHODOLOGY OF ART MADE MAN

This project combines "best practices" of three different methods:

- Dance
- Art
- Handicraft

The Dance Movement component is characterized by the theme 'I am - I give - I communicate - I'm with the others'.

The Art Therapy component is characterized by the theme of 'Create - communicate - I create with others'.

The Handycraft component is characterized by the theme 'I am - I am planning - I produce'.

Each of these components affects the psycho-social dimension of the individual characteristics and abilities of the different target groups. To combine the three components, the AMM team uses partners with specific expertise and professionalism in the three different sectors.

During the third coordination meeting was held the workshop on integrated approach targeting AMM trainers who are going to led the laboratories in each partner country. It was a pilot trial during which the 'technical' partners of the project (ATI and REELGART) led the trainers of the other beneficiaries countries involved in the testing phase of the integrated methodology of "Art Made Man".
